In addition to providing funding, our league members volunteer and provide organizations with the woman-power needed to support the day-to-day activities and needs of local nonprofits. Since we began work in the space of alleviating food insecurity in Pittsburgh in 2015, our league has served over 7,500 hours.

The Junior League of Pittsburgh proudly awarded a \$1,000 grant to **Reimagine Food Systems - Protect PT** at our Spring Tea event on March 29, 2025.

Reimagine Food Systems is a local initiative dedicated to **increasing community access to healthy, fresh produce and pollinator-friendly spaces through regenerative gardening**. By providing materials, resources, and education to low-income families in Allegheny and Westmoreland Counties, the initiative aims to remove barriers to home gardening and foster deeper connections between people, food, and the earth. The program is sponsored by Protect PT (Penn-Trafford).

A single garden can provide **healthy food options** and empower a family living in a local food desert. In this way, gardening becomes a revolutionary act—one that creates radical change, one raised bed at a time.

The Junior League of Pittsburgh’s grant will support the purchase of soil, seeds, seedlings, raised beds, educational materials, and gardening tools.

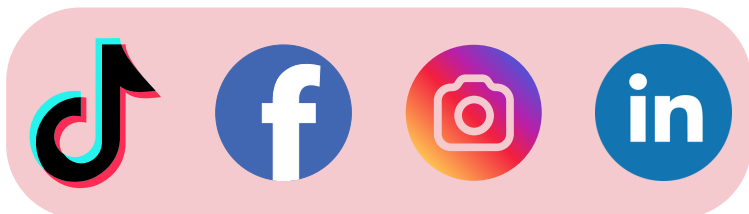
In 2024-2025, our digital presence continued to climb: on Instagram, 115 posts—including 19 Reels—**reached 19,384 accounts, sparked 2.1K interactions, and grew our following by 11 percent to 1,211 followers.** TikTok added momentum with 26K video views, 250 profile visits, 677 likes, and 26 comments, **driven largely by the For You page and search traffic.** Together these metrics show more people than ever are discovering and engaging with the Junior League of Pittsburgh’s mission.

Strong Ties to the Children's Museum

Sam Bretz, an Active member and current JLP Treasurer, was selected by the Children's Museum of Pittsburgh to serve on the board. The Children's Museum offers hands-on, interactive experiences that inspire kindness, creativity, and curiosity in children. This beloved institution's award-winning exhibits and programs, including the addition of MuseumLab, have made it a must-visit destination for families in and around Pittsburgh. With a degree in Economics and minors in Arts, Dance, and Movement Studies, **Sam brings a unique combination of business acumen and a passion for children to the Children's Museum Board.** As a Product Operations Marketing Manager with Boston Scientific and an experienced volunteer "playologist" at the Minnesota Children's Museum, Sam possesses strong leadership and interpersonal skills that will contribute to the board's success.



Jessica Lynch Joins the Vintage Board

Jessica Lynch, a Sustainer member, has begun her three-year term on the board of Vintage, Inc., a nonprofit organization dedicated to improving the experience of aging in our community. At Vintage Center for Active Adults, individuals can stay active and healthy, maintain their independence, pursue their interests, and make new friends. Vintage's commitment to promoting social and physical well-being aligns perfectly with Jessica's own values.

Jessica brings a wealth of experience to her new role. Her impressive resume includes work as a mediator, arbitrator, and early neutral evaluator, specializing in employment law, custody, and landlord-tenant disputes. She also serves as an adjunct faculty member at the University of Pittsburgh School of Law and has previously held teaching positions at California University of Pennsylvania and Slippery Rock University. For many years, Jessica held leadership roles in the legal departments of global corporations and non-profit organizations.



AWARDS & RECOGNITIONS

AJLI 40 OVER 40



The Junior League of Pittsburgh proudly honors sustaining member **Jeanne Berdik**, as one of the Association of Junior Leagues International's inaugural 40 Over 40 Award winners—an honor given to just 40 leaders from 297 Leagues across six countries.

As Pittsburgh **League President in 1983**, **Jeanne helped secure the site and early funding for the Pittsburgh Children's Museum**, now one of the nation's top children's museums. In 2003, she founded the Pittsburgh chapter of ARCS Foundation, raising over \$3 million for doctoral research at Carnegie Mellon and the University of Pittsburgh. She later served as national ARCS president and now chairs a permanent endowment. Jeanne also contributed to the Pittsburgh Botanic Garden's master plan.

After moving to Orleans, Massachusetts, **she founded Pollinator Pathway Cape Cod** and serves as trustee of the Orleans Conservation Trust.

Jeanne credits Junior League training and her work on AJLI's 1986-88 Membership Diversification Committee for shaping her leadership style. "The League taught me how to convene partners, listen first, and act boldly," she says—skills she continues to apply in both Pennsylvania and Massachusetts.

She was honored with fellow 40 Over 40 recipients at the **AJLI Annual Conference in Orlando on May 29, 2025**.
